#### **MINUTES**

A Regular Meeting of Walterboro City Council was held at City Hall on Tuesday, August 11, 2015 at 6:15 P.M., with Mayor Bill Young presiding.

<u>PRESENT WERE:</u> Mayor Bill Young, Council Members: Jimmy Syfrett, Paul Siegel, Tom Lohr, Bobby Bonds, James Broderick and Judy Bridge. City Manager Jeff Molinari, City Clerk Betty Hudson and City Attorney George Cone were also present. There were approximately 10 persons present in the audience.

There being a quorum present, Mayor Young called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Council Member Syfrett gave the invocation and Council Member Lohr led the pledge of allegiance to our flag.

The Mayor then took a few minutes to address a concern from citizens on when the City would complete the Mt. Carmel intersection project. Council was in receipt of a letter from Mr. Ben Barnett on behalf of the Walterboro Rotary Club regarding the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Ireland Creek Run on Thursday, October 8, 2015. This organization requested the following:

- Close one side of Ireland Creek Road and Ivanhoe Road between Washington Street and Forest Hills Road from 5:00 - 7:00 P.M. on October 8<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. Reserve the picnic area on Ireland Creek October 8, 2015, 1-9 p.m. (tent and tables).
- Allow for event directional signs to be placed where appropriate in the City. Signs will be 18" x 24".

#### **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT:**

 Presentation on "Braq a Little About Walterboro" Campaign, Michelle Strickland, Tourism Director

Ms. Strickland stated that as Tourism Director, it is her goal to get the word out about Walterboro. We do that every day with our advertising, billboards, on-line advertising in our social media.

She said, I would like to introduce a concept that really gets back to the basics and utilizes our greatest resource in Walterboro, which is our people. I would like to call it the "Brag" campaign. She further stated that everyone knows that word of mouth is the most fundamental method of advertising. I think that we could get our people really in touch with what it is that they love about living here, then maybe they can become ambassadors for our City and really help enhance our advertising and marketing efforts.

Ms. Strickland explained that she would like to designate one week in September, specifically September 19-26, to focus on marketing locally. During that week, we would like businesses and residents to display signs and wear stickers to "Brag a Little About Walterboro." These would be temporary signs, similar to political signs, but not as heavy duty, about 18"x 24" or possibly 12" x 18". She stated that she would like to purchase these signs out of her local promotional budget. This does not qualify for A-tax funding. She said, I think that this local outreach will be well worth the money.

To get this campaign going, Ms. Strickland informed Council that she would be distributing materials at local events like the Volunteer Fair and the Animal Shelter's Walk and Wag, and in cooperation with USC-Salk marketing classes and the Boy Scouts.

Mayor Young added that sometimes we tend to focus on the negative, so this will get everybody focusing on the good things. Council Member Siegel agreed this is a good idea.
