MINUTES

A Regular Meeting of Walterboro City Council was held at City Hall on Tuesday, February 25, 2014, at 6:15 P.M. with Mayor Bill Young presiding.

PRESENT WERE: Mayor Bill Young, Council Members: Jimmy Syfrett, Paul Siegel, Tom Lohr, Bobby Bonds, James Broderick and Judy Bridge. City Manager Jeff Molinari, City Clerk Betty Hudson, City Attorney George Cone along with Attorney Clenton Campbell, were also present. Fourteen (14) persons were present in the audience.

There being a quorum present, Mayor Young called the meeting to order. Council Member Syfrett gave the invocation and Council Member Bridge led the pledge of allegiance to our flag.

PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA ITEMS:

- 6. Applicant shall obtain all necessary permits in order to complete the project including SCDOT encroachment permit and SCDHEC NPDES permit if applicable. The Sediment and Erosion Control plan and National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit is required if the disturbed acreage of the contract is 1.0 acre or more. The applicant will be held responsible for paying all fines assessed by DHEC if found in noncompliance with the NPDES regulations. Regulations may be reviewed at http://www.scstatehouse.net/coderegs/c063.htm).
- 7. Provide the CTC with copies of all records and permits as referenced above upon request.
- 8. No project cost will be paid without valid project specific documentation/invoices and a completed Request for Payment Invoice.
- 9. Maintain copies of all records for a period of five years from the date of final acceptance by the CTC.
- 10. Applicant shall abide by the Set Aside Law (Section 12-28-2930) and provide documentation to this effect to the CTC.
- 11. Applicant shall have 1 year after approval of project by the CTC to initiate construction
- 12. Applicant shall provide for quality control on the project for materials and labor utilizing an independent testing firm and provide documentation to this effect to the CTC upon request.
