Walterboro City Council Public Hearing and Regular Meeting May 13, 2014

### **MINUTES**

A Public Hearing and Regular Meeting of Walterboro City Council was held at City Hall on Tuesday, May 13, 2014, at 6:15 P.M. with Mayor Bill Young presiding.

**PRESENT WERE:** Mayor Bill Young, Council Members: Jimmy Syfrett, Paul Siegel, Tom Lohr, Bobby Bonds, James Broderick and Judy Bridge. City Manager Jeff Molinari, City Clerk Betty Hudson, and City Attorney George Cone were also present. Thirty-eight (38) persons were present in the audience.

There being a quorum present, Mayor Young called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to the meeting. He said, we have some special guests with us and also glad to have Solicitor Duffy Stone with us. Council Member Syfrett gave the invocation and Council Member Broderick led the pledge of allegiance to our flag.

## **PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA ITEMS:**

There were no comments or questions on agenda items.

### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

The Mayor then opened a public hearing, duly advertised to receive public comments on Ordinance # 2014-02, to Amend the Unified Development Ordinance of the City of Walterboro, So As to Clarify and Strengthen Portions of the Ordinance. The Mayor then recognized Mr. David Dodd, Planning Director, to give an overview on this public hearing item.

Mr. Dodd stated that the Planning Commission has recommended some changes to the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) to correct errors, improve clarity and enhance business friendliness. These changes are:

- Add "correctional facility" to be used as a Special Exception in the General Commercial District on parcels that are a minimum of 2 ½ acres. (This will allow the Colleton County Jail to replace a dilapidated section of the older part of their building).
- Section 3.4.4 Delete item B which limits automotive service locations from having certain driveway distances from each other or intersections would be removed to give them the same driveway restrictions as imposed by SCDOT as all other businesses.
- 3. Add the condition of "permanent" to signs that require a certificate of zoning compliance with the associated fee of \$50 zoning compliance fee. In that way, temporary signs would no longer be charged this \$50.00 fee.
- 4. To allow the free standing signs in the General Commercial District maximum size to change from 16 sq. feet to 48 sq. feet. This will allow most of the General Commercial signs currently existing to become compliant , rather than being non-conforming, and will allow new businesses that come in to have a sign that's larger than what the ordinance currently would restrict it to.
- 5. Change the heavy vehicle special exceptions approval to include a one year limit, so that it would have to be revisited on an annual basis if they want to continue to keep another year after it's approved. To make some other grammatical corrections. To allow the sign faces on non-conforming signs sizes to allow to be maintained or replaced if they are damaged, as long as they do not change the cabinet size, to keep the messages current and the signs in good working order.
- 6. Section 10.4.1B Planning Commission membership is being corrected to "four" year term to be consistent with the Walterboro Municipal Code.
- 7. To require the "grandfathered" electronic message display signs to come into compliance within 180 days after this change is adopted. So the appearance of

motion will not be allowed on electronic message display signs on the ones that are already in existence at the time the original UDO was adopted in 2012. It has given them the advantage to have an appearance of motion, when new LED signs are not allowed to, and so we will give all businesses the same even chance to advertise.

The Mayor then opened the floor to receive any public comments or questions. Ms. Marsha Johnson raised concern on the change being made to Section 10.4.1B, Membership Planning Commission, of the UDO. She expressed concern that all the members shall continue to serve on the committee "until" their successors are appointed by City Council. Mr. Dodd noted that the only change being made to this section is to change the current term from "three" years to "four" years.

## **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:**

The Minutes of the April 22, 2014 Public Hearing and Regular Meeting were approved as submitted upon the motion of Council Member Broderick, seconded by Council Member Bridge, with all members voting in favor.

### **PROCLAMATIONS AND RESOLUTIONS:**

- 1. Proclamation No. 2014-05, to Recognize Police Week in the City of Walterboro, May 11-17, 2014.

  A motion was made by Council Member Lohr, seconded by Council Member Siegel to adopt Proclamation No. 2014-05 as submitted. The motion passed unanimously. The Mayor then read the proclamation in its entirety into the records. A copy of said proclamation is attached as part of these minutes.
- 2. <u>Proclamation No. 2014-06, to Recognize the Colleton County High School Band of Blue Varsity Winter Guard.</u> A motion was made by Council Member Bonds, seconded by Council Member Bridge to adopt Proclamation No. 2014-06 as submitted. The motion passed unanimously. A copy of the proclamation is attached as part of these minutes.

Mayor Young then called to the podium to recognize the students present from the Colleton County High School Varsity Winter Guard, along with CCHS Band Director Tom Finigan, and CCMS instructor Stacy Miller and his assistants Jeff Cobbs and William Thomas. The Mayor announced that the members of the Varsity Winter Guard won the 2014 Class SAA CWEA Regional Championship and competed with other schools from North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. The Mayor read the proclamation in its entirety into the records and presented a copy to Mr. Tom Finigan. Before leaving, Mr. Tom Finigan asked all the parents of the students to also stand for recognition.

3. **Resolution No. 2014-R-04**, A Resolution Recognizing and Commending Thomas Finigan, Jr. upon the occasion of receiving the U.S. Army All-American Band Status for 2014, was approved on the motion of Council Member Siegel, seconded by Council Member Broderick and passed with all members voting in favor. Mr. Thomas Finigan, Jr. (son of Tom and Lori Finigan) a senior at Colleton County High School, was one of two students selected from South Carolina and one of 16 trumpet players to make the U.S. Army All-American Marching Band 2014. He was honored for his exceptional accomplishment, musicianship, leadership and shining example he sets for his fellow band members and classmates. The Mayor read the resolution in its entirety into the records and presented a copy to Mr. Finigan, Jr. A copy of said resolution is attached as part of these minutes.

Dear Mayor Young and City Council,

I am writing to inform you about our Back Yard Bible Club (BYBC) meeting at Pinckney Park on the dates of July 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of 2014. This BYBC will be conducted under the umbrella of Mission Serve (John Barnes and Wayne Lake), which will be going on that same week in Walterboro. Rev Jeff Leopard of First Baptist Church and Rev Leon Maxwell of St Peters AME are partnering to accomplish this BYBC. Rev Leopard and Rev Maxwell will be responsible for all activities of the BYBC.

The BYBC will be from 10 am to 12 noon each day. There will be approximately 6 to 8 teenagers and 4 to 5 adults each day at the park. The teenagers will be conducting the activities and the adults will be their supervisors. Set Apart Student Ministries at First Baptist and the Youth at St Peters AME are going to be training the teenagers for the activities. Our target audience will be children from 3 years old to 10 years old. The schedule will go as follows: 10:00 to 10:20 (Registration and Rec Game), 10:20 to 10:30 (Silly Songs / Water Break), 10:30 to 11:00 (Bible Story / Water), 11:00 to 11:15 (Rec Game / Water), 11:15 to 11:30 (Snack / Lemonade), 11:30 to 12:00 (Rec Time / Water).

The goal of the BYBC is to expose the children to the teaching from the Bible about Jesus Christ. The Bible Stories will be taught by the teenagers and supervised by the adults. The Recreation games will be run by the teenagers and supervised by the adults. Rev Leopard and Rev Maxwell desire for the children to hear the good news of Jesus Christ. This is a free community event and all children of the community from 3 to 10 yrs old are invited to attend. We expect to have around 30 to 40 children show up each day.

Rev Leopard and Rev Maxwell chose Pinckney Park because of its recent renovation and its location. Walterboro is working hard on renovating the city parks and we want to help promote the use of the parks. Rev Maxwell's church is only 2 blocks away in case of weather issues or bathroom issues. We will have adults stationed for making sure children get safely to the park and get home from the park.

The playground, shelter, picnic tables and the grass fields of the park will be used. First Baptist and St Peters will supply the rest of the needed equipment. We do not need any electricity. We will be displaying a Mission Serve banner and we will have plenty of water for the children to stay hydrated. All trash will be picked up and everything will be in order before we leave each day. We hope that this event will help some of our Colleton County children see some positive role models in the teenagers and adults that will be serving during that week at the BYBC.
