MINUTES

A Regular Meeting of Walterboro City Council was held at City Hall on Tuesday, August 12, 2014 at 6:15 P.M., with Mayor Bill Young presiding.

PRESENT WERE: Mayor Bill Young, Council Members: Jimmy Syfrett, Paul Siegel, Tom Lohr, Bobby Bonds, James Broderick and Judy Bridge. City Manager Jeff Molinari, City Clerk Betty Hudson and City Attorney George Cone were also present. There were approximately 43 persons present in the audience.

There being a quorum present, Mayor Young called the meeting to order and Council Member Syfrett gave the invocation. Council Member Broderick led the pledge of allegiance to our flag.

PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA ITEMS:

There were no public comments or questions on agenda items.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The following minutes were approved as submitted on the motion of Council Member Bridge, seconded by Council Member Broderick and passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was no Old Business before Council.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ordinance # 2014-09, An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance # 2014-04, So As to
 Set the Local Option Sales Tax Credit Factor in the Fiscal Year 2014-2015
 Budget, First Reading.

Mayor Young read the first reading to the title of the proposed Ordinance.

City Manager Molinari informed Council that in previous years, the City has been able to set the Local Option Sales Tax Credit as part of the budget document. The Local Option Sales Tax Credit Factor is a very simple formula. You take your anticipated collections and divide that by the total appraised value within the City. We have to rely on the County for that information. We did not have that information before June 30. We are required by law to set the Local Option Sales Tax Credit Factor. Once we set that, we will send that information to the County auditor, so it can be reflected in the tax bills that will go out in the fall.

Council Member Siegel made a motion giving First Reading Approval to Ordinance # 2014-09. Council Member Lohr seconded the motion. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carried.

Consideration of Bids Received for Purchase of Pickup Truck for Utilities
 Department

City Manager Molinari stated that the Utilities Department has \$25,000 budgeted in the fiscal year 2014-2015 budget for the purchase of a full size pickup truck. The City solicited bids from two local dealers, as well as a bid from the state contract. We

received a bid from one local dealer, a no bid from the other local dealer, as well as the state contract price. The bids received were as follows:

Rizer Chevrolet (Walterboro, SC) - No Bid
Love Chevrolet (State Contract) - \$27,171.00
Walterboro Ford (Walterboro, SC) - \$25,000.00

Mr. Molinari stated that the low qualified bidder was Walterboro Ford in the amount of \$25,000.00. He concluded by stating that City staff asks for Council's favorable consideration of the low bidder.

A motion was made by Council Member Broderick, seconded by Council Member Siegel, to accept the low bid from Walterboro Ford in the amount of \$25,000.00. In discussing the motion, Council Member Bonds asked how much was budgeted for this automobile. Mr. Molinari answered that the City budgeted \$25,000.00. All in favor, none opposed. The motion carried.

Consideration of a Parade Request by Mr. Horace Simmons, Action Line Against Violence

Mayor Young then entertained a motion to approve the request. Council Member Siegel made a motion to approve the parade permit request as submitted by Mr. Horace Simmons. Council Member Lohr seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 2014-09

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE # 2014-04, SO AS TO SET THE LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX CREDIT FACTOR IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015 BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2014-2015 budget was adopted with the passage of Ordinance # 2014-04 on June 10, 2014; and,

WHEREAS, City Council has determined that a need exists to amend said budget to set the Local Option Sales Tax Credit Factor for the fiscal year 2014-2015 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, that the fiscal year 2014-2015 budget be amended as follows:

1. A local option sales tax credit factor of .001615 shall be established.

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
