City Manager Molinari gave a summary for the business license ordinance stating there would be the creation of a centralized business licensing system. This ordinance is the culmination of years of work with the Municipal Association and the General Assembly.

In September 2020, the General Assembly passed Act 176 which streamlines the business license process across the state. This act creates the same process for taxing jurisdictions across South Carolina. Details of Act 176 include the following:

- A standard due date of April 30th
- A business license year of May 1st April 30th
- Gross income to be based on the prior calendar year or business fiscal year
- Standard application as approved by S.C. Revenue and Fiscal Affairs North
- All businesses will be listed in the standard class schedule according to their North American Industry Classification System code, or NAIS code
- Standard class schedule is adopted by the S.C. Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office
- Creation of the Local Business License Renewal Center, an online payment portal where businesses can renew all their local licenses at one time.

The mandate of the license year will extend the City's current license year from an expiration date of December 31, 2021 to April 30, 2022 which has been incorporated in the business license ordinance.

ORDINANCE # 2021-06

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 8, BUSINESS LICENSE AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, ARTICLE I, IN GENERAL AND ARTICLE II, BUSINESS LICENSE ORDINANCE, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA, AND TO REPLACE SAID CHAPTER 8 ORDINANCE WITH CHAPTER 8 ENTITLED BUSINESS LICENSE ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Association of South Carolina (MASC) regularly updates the Model Business License Ordinance to incorporate improvements necessitated by changes in the legal and economic application of business license regulations; and,

WHEREAS, it is the interest of the City and the operators of businesses within the City that the business license ordinance be updated to be consistent with the statewide application of business license regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, that all prior business license ordinances are repealed and the attached business license ordinance is adopted and shall continue in effect from year to year as hereafter amended.

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.

CITY OF WALTERBORO

BUSINESS LICENSE ORDINANCE

Section 1. <u>License Required</u>. Every person engaged or intending to engage in any business, calling, occupation, profession, or activity engaged in with the object of gain, benefit, or advantage, in whole or in part within the limits of the City of Walterboro, South Carolina, is required to pay an annual license tax for the privilege of doing business and obtain a business license as herein provided.

Section 2. <u>Definitions.</u> The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meaning ascribed herein. Defined terms are not capitalized when used in this ordinance unless the context otherwise requires.

"Business" means any business, calling, occupation, profession, or activity engaged in with the object of gain, benefit, or advantage, either directly or indirectly.

"Charitable Organization" means an organization that is determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be exempt from Federal income taxes under 26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3), (4), (6), (7), (8), (10) or (19).

"Charitable Purpose" means a benevolent, philanthropic, patriotic, or eleemosynary purpose that does not result in personal gain to a sponsor, organizer, officer, director, trustee, or person with ultimate control of the organization.

"Classification" means that division of businesses by NAICS codes subject to the same license rate as determined by a calculated index of ability to pay based on national averages, benefits, equalization of tax burden, relationships of services, or other basis deemed appropriate by the Council.

"Council" means City Council of the City of Walterboro.

"Domicile" means a principal place from which the trade or business of a licensee is conducted, directed, or managed. For purposes of this ordinance, a licensee may be deemed to have more than one domicile.

"Gross Income" means the gross receipts or gross revenue of a business, received or accrued, for one calendar or fiscal year collected or to be collected from business done within the Municipality. If the licensee has a domicile within the Municipality, business done within the Municipality shall include all gross receipts or revenue received or accrued by such licensee. If the licensee does not have a domicile within the Municipality, business done within the Municipality shall include only gross receipts or revenue received or accrued within the Municipality. In all cases, if the licensee pays a business license tax to another county or municipality, then the licensee's gross income for the purpose of computing the tax within the Municipality must be reduced by the amount of revenues or receipts taxed in the other county or municipality and fully reported to the Municipality. Gross income for business license tax purposes shall not include taxes collected for a governmental entity, escrow funds, or funds that are the property of a third party. The value of bartered goods or trade-in merchandise shall be included in gross income. The gross receipts or gross revenues for business license purposes may

be verified by inspection of returns and reports filed with the Internal Revenue Service, the South Carolina Department of Revenue, the South Carolina Department of Insurance, or other government agencies. In calculating gross income for certain businesses, the following rules shall apply:

- A. Gross income for agents shall be calculated on gross commissions received or retained, unless otherwise specified. If commissions are divided with other brokers or agents, then only the amount retained by the broker or agent is considered gross income.
- B. Except as specifically required by S.C. Code § 38-7-20, gross income for insurance companies shall be calculated on gross premiums written.
- C. Gross income for manufacturers of goods or materials with a location in the Municipality shall be calculated on the lesser of (i) gross revenues or receipts received or accrued from business done at the location, (ii) the amount of income allocated and apportioned to that location by the business for purposes of the business's state income tax return, or (iii) the amount of expenses attributable to the location as a cost center of the business. Licensees reporting gross income under this provision shall have the burden to establish the amount and method of calculation by satisfactory records and proof. Manufacturers include those taxpayers reporting a manufacturing principal business activity code on their federal income tax returns.

"License Official" means a person designated to administer this ordinance. Notwithstanding the designation of a primary license official, the Municipality may designate one or more alternate license officials to administer particular types of business licenses, including without limitation for business licenses issued to businesses subject to business license taxes under Article 20, Chapter 9, Title 58, and Chapters 7 and 45, Title 38, of the South Carolina Code.

"Licensee" means the business, the person applying for the license on behalf of the business, an agent or legal representative of the business, a person who receives any part of the net profit of the business, or a person who owns or exercises control of the business.

"Municipality" means the City of Walterboro, South Carolina.

"NAICS" means the North American Industry Classification System for the United States published under the auspices of the Federal Office of Management and Budget.

"Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, limited liability partnership, limited liability company, cooperative non-profit membership, corporation, joint venture, association, estate, trust, business trust, receiver, syndicate, holding company, or other group or combination acting as a unit, in the singular or plural, and the agent or employee having charge or control of a business in the absence of the principal.

Section 3. Purpose and Duration. The business license required by this ordinance is for the purpose of providing such regulation as may be required for the business subject thereto and for the purpose of raising revenue for the general fund through a privilege tax. The license year ending on April 30, 2022, shall commence on January 1, 2021 and shall run for a sixteen (16) month period. Thereafter, the license periods shall be established as follows. Except as set forth below for business licenses issued to contractors with respect to specific construction projects,

each yearly license shall be issued for the twelve-month period of May 1 to April 30. A business license issued for a construction contract may, at the request of the licensee, be stated to expire at the completion of the construction project; provided, any such business license may require that the licensee file, by each April 30 during the continuation of the construction project, a statement of compliance, including but not limited to a revised estimate of the value of the contract. If any revised estimate of the final value of such project exceeds the amount for which the business license was issued, the licensee shall be required to pay a license fee at the then-prevailing rate on the excess amount. The provisions of this ordinance and the rates herein shall remain in effect from year to year as amended by the Council.

Section 4. <u>Business License Tax, Refund.</u>

- A. The required business license tax shall be paid for each business subject hereto according to the applicable rate classification on or before the due date of the 30th day of April in each year, except for those businesses in Rate Class 8 for which a different due date is specified. Late payments shall be subject to penalties as set forth in Section 12 hereof, except that admitted insurance companies may pay before June 1 without penalty.
- B. A separate license shall be required for each place of business and for each classification or business conducted at one place. If gross income cannot be separated for classifications at one location, the business license tax shall be computed on the combined gross income for the classification requiring the highest rate. The business license tax must be computed based on the licensee's gross income for the calendar year preceding the due date, for the licensee's twelve-month fiscal year preceding the due date, or on a twelve-month projected income based on the monthly average for a business in operation for less than one year. The business license tax for a new business must be computed on the estimated probable gross income for the balance of the license year. A business license related to construction contract projects may be issued on a perproject basis, at the option of the taxpayer. No refund shall be made for a business that is discontinued.
- C. A licensee that submits a payment greater than the amount owed may request a refund. To be considered, a refund request must be submitted in writing to the Municipality before the June 1 immediately following the April 30 on which the payment was due and must be supported by adequate documentation supporting the refund request. The Municipality shall approve or deny the refund request, and if approved shall issue the refund to the business, within thirty days after receipt of the request.

Section 5. Registration Required.

A. The owner, agent, or legal representative of every business subject to this ordinance, whether listed in the classification index or not, shall register the business and make application for a business license on or before the due date of each year; provided, a new business shall be required to have a business license prior to operation within the Municipality, and an annexed business shall be required to have a business license within thirty (30) days of the annexation. A license for a bar (NAICS 722410) must be issued in

- the name of the individual who has been issued the corresponding state alcohol, beer, or wine permit or license and will have actual control and management of the business.
- B. Application shall be on the then-current standard business license application as established and provided by the Director of the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office and shall be accompanied by all information about the applicant, the licensee, and the business deemed appropriate to carry out the purpose of this ordinance by the license official. Applicants may be required to submit copies of portions of state and federal income tax returns reflecting gross receipts and gross revenue figures.
- C. The applicant shall certify under oath that the information given in the application is true, that the gross income is accurately reported (or estimated for a new business) without any unauthorized deductions, and that all assessments, personal property taxes on business property, and other monies due and payable to the Municipality have been paid.
- D. The Municipality shall allow application, reporting, calculation, and payment of business license taxes through the business license tax portal hosted and managed by the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office, subject to the availability and capability thereof. Any limitations in portal availability or capability do not relieve the applicant or Licensee from existing business license or business license tax obligations.

Section 6. <u>Deductions, Exemptions, and Charitable Organizations.</u>

- A. No deductions from gross income shall be made except income earned outside of the Municipality on which a license tax is paid by the business to some other municipality or county and fully reported to the Municipality, taxes collected for a governmental entity, or income which cannot be included for computation of the tax pursuant to state or federal law. Properly apportioned income from business in interstate commerce shall be included in the calculation of gross income and is not exempted. The applicant shall have the burden to establish the right to exempt income by satisfactory records and proof.
- B. No person shall be exempt from the requirements of the ordinance by reason of the lack of an established place of business within the Municipality, unless exempted by state or federal law. The license official shall determine the appropriate classification for each business in accordance with the latest issue of NAICS. No person shall be exempt from this ordinance by reason of the payment of any other tax, unless exempted by state law, and no person shall be relieved of liability for payment of any other tax or fee by reason of application of this ordinance.
- C. Wholesalers are exempt from business license taxes unless they maintain warehouses or distribution establishments within the Municipality. A wholesale transaction involves a sale to an individual who will resell the goods and includes delivery of the goods to the reseller. It does not include a sale of goods to a user or consumer.
- D. A charitable organization shall be exempt from the business license tax on its gross income unless it is deemed a business subject to a business license tax on all or part of its gross income as provided in this section. A charitable organization, or any affiliate of a charitable organization, that reports income from for-profit activities or unrelated

- business income for federal income tax purposes to the Internal Revenue Service shall be deemed a business subject to a business license tax on the part of its gross income from such for-profit activities or unrelated business income.
- E. A charitable organization shall be deemed a business subject to a business license tax on its total gross income if (1) any net proceeds of operation, after necessary expenses of operation, inure to the benefit of any individual or any entity that is not itself a charitable organization as defined in this ordinance, or (2) any net proceeds of operation, after necessary expenses of operation, are used for a purpose other than a charitable purpose as defined in this ordinance. Excess benefits or compensation in any form beyond fair market value to a sponsor, organizer, officer, director, trustee, or person with ultimate control of the organization shall not be deemed a necessary expense of operation.

Section 7. False Application Unlawful. It shall be unlawful for any person subject to the provisions of this ordinance to make a false application for a business license or to give or file, or direct the giving or filing of, any false information with respect to the license or tax required by this ordinance.

Section 8. <u>Display and Transfer.</u>

- A. All persons shall display the license issued to them on the original form provided by the license official in a conspicuous place in the business establishment at the address shown on the license. A transient or non-resident shall carry the license upon his person or in a vehicle used in the business readily available for inspection by any authorized agent of the Municipality.
- B. A change of address must be reported to the license official within ten (10) days after removal of the business to a new location and the license will be valid at the new address upon written notification by the license official and compliance with zoning and building codes. Failure to obtain the approval of the license official for a change of address shall invalidate the license and subject the licensee to prosecution for doing business without a license. A business license shall not be transferable, and a transfer of controlling interest shall be considered a termination of the old business and the establishment of a new business requiring a new business license, based on old business income.
- **Section 9.** <u>Administration of Ordinance.</u> The license official shall administer the provisions of this ordinance, collect business license taxes, issue licenses, make or initiate investigations and audits to ensure compliance, initiate denial or suspension and revocation procedures, report violations to the municipal attorney, assist in prosecution of violators, produce forms, undertake reasonable procedures relating to the administration of this ordinance, and perform such other duties as may be duly assigned.

Section 10. Inspection and Audits.

- A. For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this ordinance, the license official or other authorized agent of the Municipality is empowered to enter upon the premises of any person subject to this ordinance to make inspections and to examine and audit books and records. It shall be unlawful for any such person to fail or refuse to make available the necessary books and records. In the event an audit or inspection reveals that the licensee has filed false information, the costs of the audit shall be added to the correct business license tax and late penalties in addition to other penalties provided herein. Each day of failure to pay the proper amount of business license tax shall constitute a separate offense.
- B. The license official shall have the authority to make inspections and conduct audits of businesses to ensure compliance with the ordinance. Financial information obtained by inspections and audits shall not be deemed public records, and the license official shall not release the amount of business license taxes paid or the reported gross income of any person by name without written permission of the licensee, except as authorized by this ordinance, state or federal law, or proper judicial order. Statistics compiled by classifications are public records.

Section 11. <u>Assessments, Payment under Protest, Appeal.</u>

- A. Assessments, payments under protest, and appeals of assessment shall be allowed and conducted by the Municipality pursuant to the provisions of S.C. Code § 6-1-410, as amended. In preparing an assessment, the license official may examine such records of the business or any other available records as may be appropriate and conduct such investigations and statistical surveys as the license official may deem appropriate to assess a business license tax and penalties as provided herein.
- B. The license official shall establish a uniform local procedure consistent with S.C. Code § 6-1-410 for hearing an application for adjustment of assessment and issuing a notice of final assessment; provided that for particular types of business licenses, including without limitation for business licenses issued to businesses subject to business license taxes under Article 20, Chapter 9, Title 58, and Chapters 7 and 45, Title 38, of the South Carolina Code, the Municipality, by separate ordinance, may establish a different procedure and may delegate one or more rights, duties, and functions hereunder to the Municipal Association of South Carolina.

Section 12. <u>Delinquent License Taxes, Partial Payment.</u>

- A. For non-payment of all or any part of the correct business license tax, the license official shall impose and collect a late penalty of five (5%) percent of the unpaid tax for each month or portion thereof after the due date until paid. Penalties shall not be waived. If any business license tax remains unpaid for sixty (60) days after its due date, the license official shall report it to the municipal attorney for appropriate legal action.
- B. Partial payment may be accepted by the license official to toll imposition of penalties on the portion paid; *provided*, however, no business license shall be issued or renewed until the full amount of the tax due, with penalties, has been paid.

Section 13. Notices. The license official may, but shall not be required to, mail written notices that business license taxes are due. If notices are not mailed, there shall be published a notice of the due date in a newspaper of general circulation within the Municipality three (3) times prior to the due date in each year. Failure to receive notice shall not constitute a defense to prosecution for failure to pay the tax due or grounds for waiver of penalties.

Section 14. Denial of License. The license official may deny a license to an applicant when the license official determines:

- A. The application is incomplete or contains a misrepresentation, false or misleading statement, or evasion or suppression of a material fact;
- B. The activity for which a license is sought is unlawful or constitutes a public nuisance per se or per accidens;
- C. The applicant, licensee, prior licensee, or the person in control of the business has been convicted within the previous ten years of an offense under a law or ordinance regulating business, a crime involving dishonest conduct or moral turpitude related to a business or a subject of a business, or an unlawful sale of merchandise or prohibited goods;
- D. The applicant, licensee, prior licensee, or the person in control of the business has engaged in an unlawful activity or nuisance related to the business or to a similar business in the Municipality or in another jurisdiction;
- E. The applicant, licensee, prior licensee, or the person in control of the business is delinquent in the payment to the Municipality of any tax or fee;
- F. A licensee has actual knowledge or notice, or based on the circumstances reasonably should have knowledge or notice, that any person or employee of the licensee has committed a crime of moral turpitude on the business premises, or has permitted any person or employee of the licensee to engage in the unlawful sale of merchandise or prohibited goods on the business premises and has not taken remedial measures necessary to correct such activity; or
- G. The license for the business or for a similar business of the licensee in the Municipality or another jurisdiction has been denied, suspended, or revoked in the previous license year.

A decision of the license official shall be subject to appeal as herein provided. Denial shall be written with reasons stated.

Section 15. Suspension or Revocation of License. When the license official determines:

- A. A license has been mistakenly or improperly issued or issued contrary to law;
- B. A licensee has breached any condition upon which the license was issued or has failed to comply with the provisions of this ordinance;
- C. A licensee has obtained a license through a fraud, misrepresentation, a false or misleading statement, or evasion or suppression of a material fact in the license application;
- D. A licensee has been convicted within the previous ten years of an offense under a law or ordinance regulating business, a crime involving dishonest conduct or moral turpitude

related to a business or a subject of a business, or an unlawful sale of merchandise or prohibited goods;

- E. A licensee has engaged in an unlawful activity or nuisance related to the business; or
- F. A licensee is delinquent in the payment to the Municipality of any tax or fee,

the license official may give written notice to the licensee or the person in control of the business within the Municipality by personal service or mail that the license is suspended pending a single hearing before Council or its designee for the purpose of determining whether the suspension should be upheld and the license should be revoked.

The written notice of suspension and proposed revocation shall state the time and place at which the hearing is to be held, and shall contain a brief statement of the reasons for the suspension and proposed revocation and a copy of the applicable provisions of this ordinance.

Section 16. Appeals to Council or its Designee.

- A. Except with respect to appeals of assessments under Section 11 hereof, which are governed by S.C. Code § 6-1-410, any person aggrieved by a determination, denial, or suspension and proposed revocation of a business license by the license official may appeal the decision to the Council or its designee by written request stating the reasons for appeal, filed with the license official within ten (10) days after service by mail or personal service of the notice of determination, denial, or suspension and proposed revocation.
- B. A hearing on an appeal from a license denial or other determination of the license official and a hearing on a suspension and proposed revocation shall be held by the Council or its designee within ten (10) business days after receipt of a request for appeal or service of a notice of suspension and proposed revocation. The hearing shall be held upon written notice at a regular or special meeting of the Council, or, if by designee of the Council, at a hearing to be scheduled by the designee. The hearing may be continued to another date by agreement of all parties. At the hearing, all parties shall have the right to be represented by counsel, to present testimony and evidence, and to cross-examine witnesses. The proceedings shall be recorded and transcribed at the expense of the party so requesting. The rules of evidence and procedure prescribed by Council or its designee shall govern the hearing. Following the hearing, the Council by majority vote of its members present, or the designee of Council if the hearing is held by the designee, shall render a written decision based on findings of fact and conclusions on application of the standards herein. The written decision shall be served, by personal service or by mail, upon all parties or their representatives and shall constitute the final decision of the Municipality.
- C. Timely appeal of a decision of Council or its designee does not effectuate a stay of that decision. The decision of the Council or its designee shall be binding and enforceable unless overturned by an applicable appellate court after a due and timely appeal.

D. For business licenses issued to businesses subject to business license taxes under Article 20, Chapter 9, Title 58, and Chapters 7 and 45, Title 38, of the South Carolina Code, the Municipality may establish a different procedure by ordinance.

Section 17. Consent, franchise, or license required for use of streets.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to construct, install, maintain, or operate in, on, above, or under any street or public place under control of the Municipality any line, pipe, cable, pole, structure, or facility for utilities, communications, cablevision, or other purposes without a consent agreement or franchise agreement issued by the Council by ordinance that prescribes the term, fees, and conditions for use.
- B. The annual fee for use of streets or public places authorized by a consent agreement or franchise agreement shall be set by the ordinance approving the agreement and shall be consistent with limits set by state law. Existing franchise agreements shall continue in effect until expiration dates in the agreements. Franchise and consent fees shall not be in lieu of or be credited against business license taxes unless specifically provided by the franchise or consent agreement.

Section 18. Confidentiality. Except in accordance with proper judicial order or as otherwise provided by law, no official or employee of the Municipality may divulge or make known in any manner the amount of income or any financial particulars set forth or disclosed in any report or return required under this ordinance. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the publication of statistics so classified as to prevent the identification of particular reports or returns. Any license data may be shared with other public officials or employees in the performance of their duties, whether or not those duties relate to enforcement of this ordinance.

Section 19. <u>Violations.</u> Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be subject to a fine of up to \$500.00 or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days or both, upon conviction. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense. Punishment for violation shall not relieve the offender of liability for delinquent taxes, penalties, and costs provided for in this ordinance.

Section 20. <u>Severability.</u> A determination that any portion of this ordinance is invalid or unenforceable shall not affect the remaining portions. To the extent of any conflict between the provisions of this ordinance and the provisions of the South Carolina Business License Tax Standardization Act, as codified at S.C. Code §§ 6-1-400 *et seq.*, the standardization act shall control.

Section 21. <u>Classification and Rates.</u>

- A. The business license tax for each class of businesses subject to this ordinance shall be computed in accordance with the current business license rate schedule, designated as Appendix A to this ordinance, which may be amended from time to time by the Council.
- B. The current business license class schedule is attached hereto as <u>Appendix B</u>. Hereafter, no later than December 31 of each odd year, the Municipality shall adopt, by ordinance, the latest standardized business license class schedule as recommended by the Municipal Association of South Carolina and adopted by the Director of the South Carolina Revenue

- and Fiscal Affairs Office. Upon adoption by the Municipality, the revised business license class schedule shall then be appended to this ordinance as a replacement <u>Appendix B</u>.
- C. The classifications included in each rate class are listed with NAICS codes, by sector, subsector, group, or industry. The business license class schedule (<u>Appendix B</u>) is a tool for classification and not a limitation on businesses subject to a business license tax. The classification in the most recent version of the business license class schedule adopted by the Council that most specifically identifies the subject business shall be applied to the business. The license official shall have the authority to make the determination of the classification most specifically applicable to a subject business.
- D. A copy of the class schedule and rate schedule shall be filed in the office of the municipal clerk.

NON-RESIDENT RATES

Unless otherwise specifically provided, all taxes and rates shall be doubled for nonresidents and itinerants having no fixed principal place of business within the Municipality.

CLASS 8 RATES

Each NAICS number designates a separate subclassification. The businesses in this section are treated as separate and individual subclasses due to provisions of state law, regulatory requirements, service burdens, tax equalization considerations, and other factors that are deemed sufficient to require individually determined rates. In accordance with state law, the Municipality also may provide for reasonable subclassifications for rates, described by an NAICS sector, subsector, or industry, that are based on particularized considerations as needed for economic stimulus or for the enhanced or disproportionate demands on municipal services or infrastructure.

Non-resident rates do not apply except where indicated.

8.1 NAICS 230000 - Contractors, Construction, All Types [Non-resident rates apply].

Resident rates, for contractors having a permanent place of business within the Municipality:

Minimum on first \$2,000 \$5	0.00 PLUS
Each additional 1,000	\$1.10

Non-resident rates apply to contractors that do not have a permanent place of business within the Municipality. A trailer at the construction site or structure in which the contractor temporarily resides is not a permanent place of business under this ordinance.

No contractor shall be issued a business license until all state and municipal qualification examination and trade license requirements have been met. Each contractor shall post a sign in plain view on each job identifying the contractor with the job.

Sub-contractors shall be licensed on the same basis as general or prime contractors for the same job. No deductions shall be made by a general or prime contractor for value of work performed by a sub-contractor.

No contractor shall be issued a business license until all performance and indemnity bonds required by the Building Code have been filed and approved. Zoning permits must be obtained when required by the Zoning Ordinance.

Each prime contractor shall file with the License Official a list of sub-contractors furnishing labor or materials for each project.

For licenses issued on a per-job basis, the total tax for the full amount of the contract shall be paid prior to commencement of work and shall entitle the contractor to complete the job without regard to the normal license expiration date. An amended report shall be filed for each new job and the appropriate additional license fee per \$1,000 of the contract amount shall be paid prior to commencement of new work. Only one base tax shall be paid in a license year. Licensees holding a per-job license shall file, by each April 30 during the continuation of the construction project, a statement of compliance, including but not limited to a revised estimate of the value of the contract. If any revised estimate of the final value of such project exceeds the amount for

which the business license was issued, the licensee shall be required to pay a license fee at the then-prevailing rate on the excess amount.

8.2 NAICS 482 – Railroad Companies (See S.C. Code § 12-23-210).

8.3 <u>NAICS 517311, 517312 – Telephone Companies.</u>

With respect to "retail telecommunications services" as defined in S. C. Code § 58-9-2200, the Municipality participates in a collections program administered by the Municipal Association of South Carolina. The Municipality has approved participation in the collections program by separate ordinance (the "Telecommunications Collections Ordinance"). The rates, terms, conditions, dates, penalties, appeals process, and other details of the business license applicable to retail telecommunications services are set forth in the Telecommunications Collections Ordinance.

8.4 NAICS 5241 – Insurance Companies:

Independent agents, brokers, their employees are subject to a business license tax based on their natural class. With respect to insurers subject to license fees and taxes under Chapter 7 of Title 38 and to brokers under Chapter 45 of Title 38, the Municipality participates in a collections program administered by the Municipal Association of South Carolina. The Municipality has approved participation in the collections program by separate ordinance (the "Insurers and Brokers Collections Ordinance"). The rates, terms, conditions, dates, penalties, appeals process, and other details of the business license applicable to insurers and brokers are set forth in the Insurers and Brokers Collections Ordinance.

8.51 NAICS 713120 – Amusement Machines, coin operated (except gambling). Music machines, juke boxes, kiddy rides, video games, pin tables with levers, and other amusement machines with or without free play feature licensed by SC Department of Revenue pursuant to S.C. Code §12-21-2720(A)(1) and (A)(2) [Type I and Type II].



The project will include decorative lighting, mast arms, stamped asphalt crosswalks, landscaping, medians, sidewalks, milling and resurfacing from Beachwood Road and Beach Road, and the relocation and upsizing of a water line on Jefferies Blvd.

The City of Walterboro's Public Works Department accepted bids on July 1, 2021, to rehabilitate the sewer system in Sub-Basin 12. This portion of the City's collection system has been investigated and found to need several major repairs. Rehabilitation will ensure reliable and improved sewer service for our citizens for many years to come. The scope of the project is to replace or reline 40 plus year old sewer mains, services, and manholes in the areas that have been determined to be failing along Hampton Street, Carn Street, Black Street, and many intersecting streets in the service area of Sub-Basin 12.

The City received bids from four (4) contractors with a low base bid of \$1,346,082.63 and a high base bid of \$1,540,093.40. The certified bid tabulation is attached.

Our engineering representatives at Hybrid Engineering Inc. have evaluated the construction experience of the bidders and found that the lowest bidder, Gulf Coast Underground, LLC has provided evidence of both experience and resources that would allow them to complete the project. It is therefore staff's recommendation to award this construction contract to Gulf Coast Underground, LLC in the amount of \$1,346,082.63 subject to the review and approval of the SCDOC-CDBG. I would also request your favorable approval of Additive Additional Bid Items A-1 through A-9 with a total price of \$47,571.51. The total cost of construction will be \$1,393,654.14.

The City of Walterboro received a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$1,348,758.00 for the construction of this project. The City of Walterboro will be required to provide additional funding in the amount of \$44,896.14. This funding would be made available from the 2021 Revenue Bond.





I have attached a memo and supporting documentation from Fire Chief Paul Seigler to purchase a new fire truck with equipment. The new truck will replace a 1999 E-One with over 100,000 miles. The Fire Department received two (2) bids, one (1) no bid and one (1) no response:

The FY 2021-2022 Fire Department budget allocated \$462,258 for the purchase of a new fire truck with equipment. The city was awarded a \$50,000 grant from USDA for a new fire truck. Although the Spartan model is \$20,903 less than the E-One model, Fire Chief Seigler recommends purchasing the E-One model because of the Fire Department's experience and positive track record with E-One trucks. City staff recommends purchasing the E-One fire truck with equipment from Wade Godfrey Safe Industries (Easley, SC) in the amount of \$460,100.00. 

I also spoke to the mechanic who does most of our work at Palmetto Fire for his opinion on Spartan's durability and quality. We have (4) E-ONE engines and the Ladder Truck is also E-ONE, so we know what to expect from E-One Manufacturing. It's important to know that this engine will be expected to last the department 20 years. This will include 15 years of service and 5 years of being a reserve engine. 

Regarding the quotes submitted for the purchase of two police interceptor vehicles, below are the parameters for the local preference option.

Sec. 2-251. - Local preference option.

- This option allows the lowest local bidder (defined as a bidder whose business is physically located and operating within the limits of the City of Walterboro or Colleton County) to match the bid submitted by the non-local low bidder if they are within a set percentage and thereby be awarded the contract.
- Whenever the purchasing agent purchases services, supplies, materials, and/or equipment for the City (b) through the use of competitive process, including quotes, bids and proposals, a percentage preference shall be used for evaluation purposes, according to the categories as set forth herein. When bid submissions are evaluated, a percentage from the local preference classification shall be deducted from the total dollar amount bid by local vendors on competitive quotes and bids, and from the total evaluated aggregate score obtained by local vendors on proposals. The total amount of local preference granted in a single bid shall not exceed an amount determined as set forth herein over a non-local vendor. The award shall be made at the price of the lowest quote, bid or proposal. If the lowest bidder after application of the local bidder preference is the local bidder, then that bidder shall have the option to match the lowest quote, bid or proposal. In the case of an absolute tie, an award will be made to the local vendor. In the case of a tie between local vendors, the award will be determined by lot.

Request to Purchase Emergency Generator for Wastewater Treatment Plant

The emergency generator at the Wastewater Treatment Plant is approximately 35 years old and failed during a scheduled exercise a few weeks ago. The service provider performing the tests determined that it would not be in the City's best interests to repair the unit due to its age and the cost of repair verses replacement. As part of the WWTP upgrade project, a new natural gas generator will be installed. However, construction on that project is 12-18 months away and the WWTP needs an emergency generator now, especially with hurricane season already underway.

Utilities Director, Wayne Crosby looked at several different options and recommended the purchase of a used generator. I authorized the Utilities Director to make an emergency purchase of a used generator in the amount of \$71,915.04 paid from net position in the Water/Sewer Enterprise Fund. Once construction on the WWTP expansion is completed, the generator will continue to be utilized in the City's water and sewer system. The installation of this unit can begin as early as July 7th. I respectfully request City Council's approval of this emergency purchase as it is critical to the operation of the WWTP.

The emergency generator at the Wastewater Treatment Plant failed to operate during a scheduled exercise. Our service provider performed tests on the unit and determined that it would not be in the City's best interest to repair the unit due to its age and the cost of repair verses replacement. As you are aware, the generator would have been replaced during the planned WWTP Upgrade and an application for grant funding for this equipment has been submitted to FEMA. We have been informed that funding through this avenue will not be available until the first of 2022.

The Utilities Department has explored several options for replacement of the generator. Options include the cost of a rental unit and/or rental and purchase of either a new or a used unit.

Temporary rental of a unit for the expected 18-month construction period of the new WWTP would ultimately cost more than the purchase price of a new unit and therefore was ruled out.

Delivery of a new generator unit is estimated to be four (4) months. This option would require the City to rent a temporary unit until the new unit arrives adding significant cost to the project.

A used unit has been located and the installation of this unit can begin as early as next Wednesday (July 7, 2021). I have attached supporting documents for both the recommendation for abandonment of the old unit and a cost estimate for the used unit installation.

I recommend the purchase of the used generator in the amount of \$71,915.04.


Re: Main Plant Generator Replacement

Bryant,

After looking further into the necessary repairs required to fix the generator at the main plant, we at Generator Services Inc. are recommending the replacement of the generator. As you know the generator at the main plant is now approximately 35 years old. The engine manufacturer no longer offers a full replacement engine for that generator. This is due to the newer emissions requirements set forth. A replacement engine, if offered would have to be brought up to today's emissions requirement. This drives the price of the engine alone to approximately Eighty Thousand dollars for a replacement engine. The only way we can get a new engine is to buy a short block and add the necessary components. This is not cost effective and is not a suggested repair. If you were to move forward with repairing the engine according to our calculations the price for repair would be 2/3 the cost of a new unit. This would leave you with a 35 year old alternator, radiator, and controls on your generator. These components are items that will have to be replaced and could lead to more costly repairs. The manufacturer only gives a one year warranty on the new short block. Investing that much money into the existing generator would not be cost effective. A replacement generator would come with a full two year manufacturer's warranty. In looking at the current situation as well as the future expansion of the plant a new generator would be a better fit. The newly proposed unit would replace your existing failed generator and can also be used with the expansion of the plant in the up coming years. The proposed generator for today's repairs is the same spec as one of the two needed for the plant expansion. We believe that purchasing a generator to use now and moving that generator to the new section of the plant when the time comes is the best idea. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions about this. We will be more than happy to move forward in any way you see fit. We feel it is our responsibility to assist you with making the best decision with your emergency generator repair or replacement.

Project/Event Description (narrative)

Olympians and professional cycling champions will compete in the 18th annual Walterboro Criterium on August 25, 2021.

The series is made up of four person teams, competing in multi-lap races in a closed circuit of about half a mile long. This racing discipline requires a unique type of rider, one who must demonstrate top speed and bike handling skills traveling at 30 mph. Because of the circular track, criteriums are the cycling equivalent to NASCAR and are known as America's contribution to the sport. To establish the track needed for the riders, we will obtain permission to close several streets in the downtown area for the race.

The Walterboro Criterium is coordinated by a group of local volunteers that represent several of the local organizations, local businesses, and interested citizens. We shortened the track at the request of the event organizers, which made the event more exciting and fast paced. The start/finish line was also moved to Hampton Street and the VIP section has been expanded to include live music, as well as a televised viewing station for other parts of the track.

In 2019, our VIP section served more than 300 guests with the addition of a catered dinner, and 60 children from ages 3-10 participated in our children's race.

Three teams also stayed in Walterboro prior to the event to do demonstrations for our local schools and bring interest and awareness to the students.

Benefit to Tourism and/or the Community

The popularity of cycling has been on the rise in recent years. Races are now staged all over the country and fans are more than willing to travel to watch them.

Walterboro is no exception, giving Walterboro international visibility, as well as additional press coverage. The races are filmed as well as live streamed with an internet hot spot connection. This enables friends and families of racers all over the world to view the progress of their team. The numbers of tourists participating in this series increases significantly each year due to the additional advertising, extended stay hotel discount packages and the continuation of the amateur and women races.

Tourists and racers stay in the local hotels, eat in our restaurants, and shop in several of the retail outlets. Visitors are charmed by the quaint downtown atmosphere and are encouraged to return by merchants and event staff. Many of our downtown merchants merchants stay open due to the extra business and increased foot traffic.

The 2019 USC CRITS Cycling Series brought a total of 169 amateur, pro and master riders to Colleton County. We estimate that approximately 75 hotel room nights were utilized by the riders, event staff, and visitors. This event also contributes to Walterboro's busiest restaurant and coffee service of the year.

This annual event has given Walterboro a reputation as a cycling community, with several other cycling events in the community such as the Tour de Lowcountry and FestiVelo.

II. Narrative:

The South Carolina Artisans Center is the largest single tourist attractions located in Walterboro. We have established through visitor surveys that our most successful marketing tool is billboards, and specifically those located on Interstate 95. Like any other established business we would like to grow in both customer count and in sales. GREAT NEWS, with the Accommodations Tax dollars we received in the past years, plus another SCPR&T TAG grant, the Center now has 2 Billboards and Banners in 4 of the SC Welcome Centers. The Artisans Center is again requesting the support of the Accommodations Tax Committee. We need to strengthen our visibility to tourists and visitors by the continuance use of the Center's (3) billboards on Interstate 95 and (2) Welcome Center Banners. We are requesting \$15,600 to continue the lease to promote the SC Artisans Center.

A. General Project Description:

The South Carolina Artisans Center was officially designated the "Official Folk Art and Craft Center of South Carolina" by the governor. The Center was originally conceived as a rural economic tourism development project. It was determined early in the planning stages that this Center should have an economic impact upon the entire state and the project's planners proceeded to make this happen. The Center now showcases the work of over 285 artists from across the state; provides educational programming and promotes community outreach to residents and visitors alike.

Some of the major accomplishments of the Center include:

We have become a major **Tourist Destination** off I-95. Approximately 372,000 people have visited the Center over the past twenty six years. Over 95% of the Center's **customers** have traveled from **outside of Colleton County** and over 85% are **visitors from another state**. The majority of our customers have taken time from their traveling to stop in Walterboro, shop at the Center and enjoy our exhibits. They are also looking for other places in Walterboro to shop and dine. The City of Walterboro has made downtown a wonderful place to send our visitors.

We also welcome tour groups and partner with SC Lowcountry Tourism for tour groups and FAM tours to heighten the awareness of our Center. As with individual visitors, these groups are looking for additional local attractions, shops, and historical venues to visit. The Center always offers information about local and area places to visit, dine, shop, and spend the night.

The South Carolina Artisans Center is the only Tourist Attraction/Retail Venue in the Walterboro area that is open for business 6 days a week. Because of these regularly scheduled hours of operation, the Center has been designated as an "official stop" for the South Carolina National Heritage Corridor.

A "stop" is a Visitors Center that distributes literature about Walterboro, Colleton County, and the entire heritage corridor.

A. General Description (Include information about innovative ideas, community support, partnerships and evidence of management capability)

Festivelo is recognized as one of the most unique bicycling festivals in the USA! Founded by Charles Fox and the Fox Family, Festivelo is a bicycling touring event based at the Farmers Market & Museum in downtown Walterboro, S.C. The ride normally brings in 250-350 riders along with an additional 50-75 people who are non-riders and/or volunteers from 20 or more states and usually a few countries each year, for several days. 2021 will mark the 24th annual FestiVELO Ride, taking place November 10-14, 2021, out of Walterboro, SC.

Our annual four-day event offers your <u>choice of morning rides</u> in the Walterboro/Colleton County area: **20-30 miles, 55-65 miles, or 95-105 mile** routes – to suit your ambition and skill level that are fully supported with restrooms, food, and mechanics.

There is <u>deficious food</u>: Hot meals at your lunch rest stops each day, and when you return to home base in Walterboro in the afternoons, we have more food and festivities for you: themed dinners, drinks, activities and entertainment planned for you to celebrate your riding accomplishments.

The terrain is flat, and once out of the Walterboro, there is not a lot of traffic. There will be multiple groups (speed/distance) for those who want to "Hammer" and those who just want to ride, stop along the routes, and visit the different attractions: All routes are flat. All these routes make good First Century Ride. Over 400 miles of riding and only 12 miles of overlap. Support and Gear (SAG): The riders and the course are constantly monitored and help is always not far away.

First time 100 Milers Thursday: On Thursday, we lead a ride for those who have never broken the 100-mile mark. The course is flat and everyone finishes. We have from 8 AM in the morning till 5 PM in the evening. Also, a trophy is given to the first time 100 milers.

Iron Butt Award: Also, ride 100 miles all 4 days and earn the Festivelo 100 Mile Iron Butt Trophy!

-PLUS every night will also include FREE S'MORES and Hot Dogs by the campfire, as well as classic movies under the stars Thursday-Saturday.

HOT MEALS EACH DAY AT THE LUNCH REST STOPS. There are multiple rest stops each day and a themed hot lunch is served on the route each day.

Walterboro affords the perfect location for a multiday bicycling event. Walterboro is located approximately an hour from Charleston, S.C., an hour from Beaufort, S.C., an hour from Hilton Head, S.C. and 1.5 hours from Savannah, Ga. The Walterboro location affords the opportunity to have a great ride early in the day and then visit Walterboro or surrounding cities in the afternoon and/or evening.

However, event organizers encourage everyone to stay in Walterboro and participate in the many different Festivelo events and visit the restaurants, antique shops, and the other businesses. The city of Walterboro has a nice downtown area with a variety of restaurants. antique shops, art, and professional services. This year, in an effort to keep ride participants

closer to downtown, we are working with a local church to bring our overnighting RVs and campers intown, adjacent to the Farmers Market and downtown Walterboro.

After riding in the morning, participants are encouraged to hike in the 800-acre wildlife sanctuary in Walterboro with hiking/biking/walking trails along with many other attractions.

B. Benefit to Tourism

Festivelo typically brings in over 400-500 people to Colleton County, from a total of 20 or more states and a few countries. In 2019, 63% of registered riders were from outside of South Carolina, and approximately 95% of registered riders were from over 50 miles outside of Walterboro. In 2019, we estimate that approximately 750 hotel room nights were utilized by the participants, along with filling the available B and B's, RV and camping locations, and that an estimated 600 total evening meals were purchased by participants throughout the Walterboro area. We program the Festivelo event from 5:30am until 9:30pm, so it is impossible for ride participants to engage in the event without engaging in the experiences provided in the City of Walterboro. Very often, ride participants bring their family members along, since there are so many social opportunities programmed around the ride. Since the ride has typically had increasing participation most years, led by roughly the same crew of organizers, the expectation is that the Walterboro Festivelo XXIII 2021 will surpass 2019. Because we cancelled our 2020 Festivelo plans, we think 2021 will see a rise in registrations, due to a combination of rolled over 2020 cancelled registrations plus new riders from the pent up demand of pandemic cabin fever.

We know our participants visit the local restaurants, antique shops, art venues, and points of interest. In addition, Festivelo makes every effort to use local vendors in Walterboro/Colleton County. This year, we are moving the location for RV's and camping to the First Baptist church. This group represents approximately 50 Festivelo participants, and for the first time this group will now have immediate, around-the-clock hour access to downtown Walterboro area and post ride activities.

The popularity of cycling has been on the rise in recent years, especially this past year, and Walterboro offers the perfect location. Positioned close to major interstates, but located in a large county where many different routes can be designed and many points of interest can be promoted on each day's ride.

Walterboro is afforded international visibility, as well as additional press coverage in all forms of media. Many segments of the rides are filmed and photographed and shared with family, friends, and the international bicycling community. The numbers of riders participating in Festivelo continues to increase each year due to the additional advertising, extended stay hotel discount packages. Festivelo demographics are represented by a median age of 55 years and a higher than average median income with disposable income. As the

population in the USA increases in median age, people are seeking events such as Festivelo to stay healthy, active, and connect with new friends.

Over the past two years, Festivelo has been directly responsible for completely booking the Bed and Breakfast venues in Walterboro, filling all allotted RV and Camping sites, and accounted for over an estimated 750 hotel nights in 2019, during the 4 day event. Our participants stay in the local hotels, eat in our various restaurants, and shop in several of the retail outlets. Additionally, anecdotal conversation from 2019 with the Arts Center shop attendant indicated sales greatly increased during Festivelo, a direct consequence of the ride. Visitors are simply charmed by the quaint atmosphere and are encouraged to return.

Additionally, Festivelo estimates the event directly contributes to the purchase of 600 evening meals from local Walterboro restaurants, based on the number of hotel nights (750) multiplied by the percentage that were registered without purchasing the onsite buffett prepared at the Farmer's Market, where Festivelo HQ is located.

C. Benefit to Community

Because of the multiple ways Festivelo impacts the local economy, including through hotels, restaurants, shops, paying for local SAG stop accommodations, the event has a financial benefit for the full spectrum of diverse communities of Walterboro. The HQ and camping are located in the city of Walterboro's downtown, additionally benefiting the local and often homegrown small businesses and shops of downtown. Additionally, the event provides a relaxed atmosphere for good natured fun and fitness, which offers only positive vibes from tourists visiting Walterboro. And finally, event organizers are homegrown in SC, with a heart for the lowcountry, so naturally cultural engagement is built into every SAG stop, giving tourists a chance to meet many others from Walterboro's various churches, etc., whose volunteers often host the SAG stops. The social settings of the SAG stops and post-ride festivities is one of many reasons ride participants come from all parts of the US to enjoy themselves.

D. Tracking: Number of hotel/motel room nights projected to be added as a direct result of this project (Include brief explanation as to the calculation used for this estimate as well as description of how you plan to track this information).

We project a conservative estimate of 800-900 hotel rooms for 2021. We know that we will have approximately 250-350 riders along with an additional 50-75 non-riders and volunteer organizers show up for 2-5 days/nights, and approximately 75% stay 3-4 nights. A conservative estimate, based upon the first two years Festivelo was located in Walterboro, Festivelo will be responsible for booking over 750-1000 hotel and Bed and Breakfast nights. Using a post ride survey from 2019 riders, we estimate that approximately 750 hotel room
