AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO PROVIDE FOR CHANGES IN THE ZONING DISTRICTS OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO BY CHANGING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF ONE PARCEL OF LAND DESIGNATED AS TMS # 163-15-00-072 FROM INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (ID) TO HIGH DENSITY RESIDENTIAL (HDR).

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Walterboro conducted a public hearing on March 18, 2025, to consider a change in zoning classification from Industrial District (ID) to High Density Residential (HDR) for the above mentioned property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said meeting, the Planning Commission has recommended that the zoning classification of the aforesaid property be changed to High Density Residential (HDR).





ORDINANCE NO. 2025-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE CONSIDERATION OF SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS AND THE ISSUANCE OF OTHER LAND USE OR DEVELOPMENT APPROVALS FOR MULTI-FAMILY DEVELOPMENTS.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Walterboro (the "City Council"), the governing body of the City of Walterboro, South Carolina (the "City"), as follows:

- **Section 1 Findings.** The City Council hereby makes the following findings of fact in connection with the enactment of this ordinance (this "*Ordinance*"):
- (a) The City Council is empowered pursuant to Section 5-7-30 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, to enact such regulations as are necessary for the security, general welfare, and convenience, of the City or for preserving health, peace, order, and good government within the City. The City Council is additionally empowered pursuant to Title 6, Chapter 29, Article 5 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (the "Act"), to regulate land use within the City. Pursuant to the Act, the City Council has enacted the City of Walterboro Unified Development Code (the "UDO") which regulates development and land use within the City.
- (b) Pursuant to Section 2.4.2 of the UDO, "*Multi-Family Dwellings*" (as defined in Appendix A, Section A.4 of the UDO) are allowed in certain zoning districts within the City as a special exception with certain conditions for development. The City Council has determined that it is appropriate to review the areas within the City where Multi-Family Dwellings are allowed and the conditions under which they may be developed, and to further consider amendments to the provisions of the UDO concerning Multi-Family Dwellings if necessary and prudent to preserve and promote the public health, safety, morals, convenience, order, appearance, prosperity, and general welfare of the City and its citizens.
- (c) To give the City Council, the City of Walterboro Planning Commission (the "*Planning Commission*"), and the City's staff adequate time to conduct such a review and consider appropriate amendments to the UDO, the City Council has determined that it is appropriate to implement a temporary moratorium on approvals for Multi-Family Dwellings within the City, as set forth in greater detail in Section 2 of this Ordinance.
- **Section 2 Moratorium on Multi-Family Developments.** By and through the enactment of this Ordinance, the City Council hereby imposes a moratorium (as described hereby, the "*Moratorium*") on the consideration of special exceptions and the issuance of certificates of zoning compliance, building permits, development plan approvals, and other similar land use, development, and construction approvals under the UDO or other City ordinances for a period of six months from the date of the enactment of this Ordinance.

- Section 3 Recommendations Regarding Multi-Family Dwelling Regulations. During the pendency of the moratorium enacted hereby, City staff and the Planning Commission are hereby directed to study the areas of the City where Multi-Family Dwellings may be located and the additional conditions under which they may be developed. The Planning Commission and City staff are further directed to prepare and recommend appropriate amendments and additional regulations to the UDO concerning Multi-Family Dwellings as may be necessary to preserve and promote the public health, safety, morals, convenience, order, appearance, prosperity, and general welfare of the City and its citizens.
- **Section 4 Pending Ordinance Doctrine.** For the sake of clarity and the avoidance of any doubt, the City Council has determined that that this Ordinance, the Moratorium imposed hereby, and its decision to consider amendments to the UDO concerning Multi-Family Dwellings shall be subject to the "pending ordinance doctrine," which shall be effective upon the first reading of this Ordinance and the publication of a notice of public hearing in connection herewith.
- **Section 5 Vested Rights.** The City Council is informed that there are no proposed developments or projects containing Multi-Family Dwellings, whether as a single-phase development or a phase of a multi-phase development, that have progressed beyond the vesting point for the establishment of vested rights pursuant to Section 1.6(A) of the UDO. The City staff, the Planning Commission, and the City's Board of Zoning Appeals are hereby directed to hold in abeyance any applications for special exceptions, development plan approvals, or other land use approvals for developments containing Multi-Family Dwellings that have been received and not yet considered by the appropriate approving-body during the pendency of the Moratorium imposed hereby.
- **Section 6 Moratorium Extension.** The City Council hereby finds and determines that the Moratorium imposed hereby may be extended by resolution of the City Council.
- **Section 7 Severability.** If any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance should be contrary to law, then such provision shall be deemed severable from the remaining provisions and shall in no way affect the validity of the other provisions of this Ordinance.
- **Section 8 Repealer.** Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, or any cause of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance, except as expressly set forth herein and as may be permitted under South Carolina law.
- **Section 9 Inconsistency.** All ordinances, resolutions or parts of any ordinances or resolutions inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict or inconsistency.
- **Section 10 Effect.** This Ordinance shall be enacted upon second reading by the City Council.

Minutes

A Regular Meeting of Walterboro City Council was held at City Hall on Tuesday, April 1, 2025, at 6:15 P.M., with Mayor Bill Young presiding.

<u>Present:</u> Joined in the meeting were: Mayor Bill Young, Councilmembers: Carl Brown, Judy Bridge, Paul Siegel, James Broderick, Greg Pryor, and Ladson Fishburne. City Manager Jeff Molinari, Assistant City Manager Ryan McLeod, City Clerk Adrienne Nettles, City Attorney Brown McLeod, Tourism Director Patricia Utsey, Finance Director Amy Risher, Utilities Director Wayne Crosby, Police Chief Wade Marvin, Fire Chief Paul Seigler, Barrett Ulm, and Cindy Warren.

Call to Order:

With the above-mentioned Councilmembers present, Mayor Young called the meeting to order and invited everyone to join in as he gave the invocation. Councilmember Fishburne led the Pledge of Allegiance to our flag.

Public Input on Agenda Items:

There was no public input on agenda items.

- 1. Ms. Cindy Warren addressed City Council about her concerns with the gun violence that is going on in Walterboro. Ms. Warren stated that she would like for the gun violence to stop so that we can embrace the small-town charm that Walterboro has to offer. Ms. Warren also stated that she wants to live in a town where she feels safe.
- 2. Mr. Barrett Ulm stated thank you for having me again tonight. I am here to talk about the ongoing gun violence. The cops are doing a great job. They are the true heroes, but we still need more done to stop the violence. If you see something, say something. Report everything that you see. Mr. Ulm also stated if you are a business owner in this town it is your right not to allow concealed weapons in your business. The citizens just want the gun violence to stop.

Mayor Young stated this ordinance is to tweak our current Nuisance Ordinance. This gives us more ability to help make people safer.

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated Mr. Mayor it gives our current Nuisance Ordinance more teeth and allows us some additional tools when dealing with problem properties.

Jamie Brown stated regarding the Nuisance Ordinance, I know a lot of it falls under DOT. I live on Wichman Street, and while our police officers have been wonderful about pulling 18 wheelers over does that fall under that nuisance ordinance?

Mayor Young stated that it is for property nuisance.

Jamie Brown stated the 18 wheelers are a nuisance to my property.

Mayor Young stated this has to do with an ordinance where private property owners are creating a nuisance.

Jamie Brown stated I know myself and neighbors have called DOT, and it is falling on deaf ears. Is it possible for our leadership to contact them?

Mayor Young asked and what would we say to them?

Jamie Brown stated signage. While signage is there, it is horrible.

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated we just updated all the signage.

Jamie Brown stated what about the sign on the other end of Wichman as you are coming up to Robertson Blvd?

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated the city has worked in conjunction with DOT for months to develop a new signage plan. DOT has gotten rid of some of the older signs. The idea is to place the signs in more strategic locations. On top of that the Police Department has amped up ticket writing.

Jamie Brown stated I do not deny that. They are great. I hear the truckers all the time arguing with the police that they did not see the signs.

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated I will also add that the City of Walterboro funded those new signs. DOT outlined the plan, but the city is the one who paid for them.

Cindy Warren asked, is there a specific branch of police that is responsible for ordinance enforcement?

Mayor Young stated Code Enforcement and the Police Department in some cases.

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated that it would be the Police Department.

City Manager's Report

1. Consideration of a request to purchase a Continental Progressive Cavity Pump for the wastewater treatment plant.

City Manager Jeff Molinari stated Mr. Mayor and members of Council you have in your agenda packet a memo and supporting documentation for a request from Utilities Director, Wayne Crosby. He is requesting permission to purchase a replacement pump for a component of the dewatering facility at the wastewater treatment plant. This is a custom-made pump and pursuant to section 2-240 of the code of ordinance falls under the definition of a sole-source procurement. Staff recommends purchasing the pump from Watershed Process Sales, LLC (Mt. Pleasant, SC) in the amount of \$25.911.36. The expenditure will be absorbed by additional capacity in the FY 2024-2025 Sewer Department budget. City staff asks for Council's favorable consideration.

WHEREAS, the 2025-2026 General Fund Budget has been presented and considered; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the budget has been properly advertised and conducted on June 3, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Walterboro, South Carolina, in Council Assembled, as follows:

- 1. The 2025-2026 City General Fund Budget is hereby adopted in the amount of \$9,625,156 with revenues and expenditures as set out in the budget document attached.
- 2. The property tax rate shall be set at ninety-nine point eighty-six (99.86) mills.

The Parks Department is requesting permission to clear fallen trees in Ireland Creek from West Washington Street to South Jefferies Blvd. The project will remove both hazardous and potentially hazardous trees ahead of the Ireland Creek Greenway and Stream Restoration project. The project also includes the removal of two (2) dilapidated wooden bridges traversing the Ireland Creek canal. On April 23rd, the Parks Department received one (1) bid and two (2) "no bids" in response to a bid invitation extended to three (3) experienced and capable contractors familiar with working in the project environment.






